- to a business program. The pathway doesn't have a graduation requirement and it is created to access the individual courses without the traditional admissions.
- B10PEN has been in development for several years, discussions were started during COVID times.
- There was a comparison to other institutions like Open Learning, which does have a similar process to allow applicants to enroll in individual courses.
- Referred to <u>Admission and Registration Policy</u>, section 3.1 which states that the
  College provides all people equal opportunity for access to programs and courses
  except where College operations are governed by legislation or accrediting
  bodies. Discussion about ensuring that the policy is aligned and maintained while
  removing barriers.
- A review process may be done after a few years to assess if the B1OPEN pathway is effective.
- Concerns about students entering math heavy course without prerequisites, the
  risk of tuition and time loss if they struggle. Other institutions like TRU Open
  Learning and BCIT still require Math 11 and suggested reconsidering including
  Math course in B1OPEN.
- The cluster has noted that some students may require some additional academic supports, and the cluster is confident that the instructors can identify if a student is really needing to have the prerequisite before starting the course(s).
- Discussed the importance of supporting students, in courses such as MATH 150 and it was proposed to add a language for admissions requirements to encourage students to connect with the program coordinator before enrolling.
- Added "We understand learners may have gaps in their knowledge that could impact their success; hence, we advise that learners meet with the Program Coordinator before enrolling." under admission requirements.

 Concerns about the courses have not go through a proper review, particularly indigenization and articulation. It was noted that the courses were last rearticulated in 2020, and the articulation is valid for up to seven years.

- Suggested that the BADM cluster bring a work plan to the next EdCo meeting to
  ensure a full review within two years. It was noted that the cluster is committed
  to regularly reviewing courses and incorporating necessary updates.
- Concerns about citing individual issues with the evaluation profiles of several courses.
- Called for a vote whether to discuss the ten (10) courses as a group.
- A roll call was conducted, resulting in a tie (6 in favor, 6 opposed, and 1 abstain)
- As per the bylaws section 5.6.5 5.6.5 Resolutions or motions receiving a tie vote shall be withdrawn. **Motion withdrawn**. Courses will be reviewed individually.

**Motion**: To address the individual courses solely based on prerequisites, corequisites, and assessment. To ensure that the courses will come through curriculum review within two years.
