# DISPLAY OF FLAGS PROCEDURE

## 1.00 PURPOSE

1.1 Coast Mountain College (CMTN) displays flags with dignity, respect, and generally established etiquette. Flags will be flown at half-mast in commemoration of federally and provincially designated days and as a sign of mourning.

### 2.00 DEFINITIONS

2.1 Half-masting: Flags are flown at the half-mast position as a sign of respect and mourning for an individual of precedence<sup>1</sup> or on special days that are federally and/or provincially designated to be commemorated.

### 3.00 RESPONSIBILITIES

- 3.1 The Facilities Director is responsible for compliance with these procedures.
- 3.2 The Facilities Director and Facilities staff are responsible for monitoring the condition of, requesting the replacement of, and disposing of flags.

### 4.00 PROCEDURES

- 4.1 Flags will be flown at half-mast to commemorate the following special days:
  - a) September 30 National Day of Truth and Reconciliation
    - b) November 8 Indigenous Veterans Day
    - c) November 11 Remembrance Day
  - d) December 6 National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence Against Women
- 4.2 Exterior flags shall be lowered to half-mast on the death of:
  - a) the Sovereign or a member of the Royal Family related in the first degree to the Sovereign (husband or wife, son or daughter, father, mother, brother, or sister)
  - b) the Governor-General or a former Governor-General
  - c) the Prime Minister of Canada or a former Prime Minister

- d) the Lieutenant-Governor of BC or a former Lieutenant-Governor
- e) the Premier of BC or a former Premier
- f) the Member of the Federal or Provincial Electoral Riding
- g) the death of a present employee of CMTN
- h) the death of a student registered in a full-time program at CMTN
- i) the death of a prominent community member or advocate for the region.
- 4.3 In addition to the foregoing, the President may order the lowering of flags to half-mast on the death of any person held in special regard in the CMTN and higher education community or in acknowledgment of other somber events.
- 4.4 The position of the flag when flying at half-mast will depend on its size, the length of the flagstaff, and its location; but as a general rule, the centre of the flag should be exactly halfway down the staff. When hoisted to or lowered from half-mast position, a flag should first be raised to the masthead.
- 4.5 For the purpose of half-masting, death shall be taken to include the day of death and the half-masting may continue for further days, at the President's discretion.
- 4.6 On occasions requiring that one flag be half-masted, all flags flown together should also be half-masted. Flags will only be half-masted on the flagpoles fitted with halyards and pulleys unless other arrangements can be made in a timely manner.
