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INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION

1.00 PURPOSE

Coast Mountain College recognizes that international education can enhance educational opportunities for the entire College community. The College will facilitate international education activities that complement its Mission Statement and operating principles.

2.00 POLICY

2.01 International education activities will not restrict or limit access for local students, rather the result should be to broaden opportunities for local students.

2.02 CMTN will attempt to reflect an international perspective in its curriculum.

2.03 International education activities may include, but not be limited to, the following:

2.03.01 Recruiting full and part time international students

2.03.02 Providing specifically designed programs of study on a contract basis

2.03.03 Creating travel-study opportunities for CMTN students

2.03.04 Promoting professional development opportunities for College personnel through exchanges and contracts abroad

2.03.05 Seeking contracts with individuals or agencies from other countries to provide a co-operative educational service

2.03.06 Encouraging partnerships with other institutions, organizations or agencies that are directly related to the kinds of activities listed above.

- 2.04 The funding of international projects will be guided by the following criteria:
 - 2.04.01 The College will operate within the guidelines specified in provincial policy related to tuition fees for international students
 - 2.04.02 There will be no continuous subsidy of international programs at the expense of programs funded by the provincial base grant
 - 2.04.03 The College will pursue partnerships with other institutions and agencies and acquire contracts for program operation and financing.
