Students will live in residence at Coast Mountain College in Terrace BC during May and June 2019. In addition to classroom and workshops, participants will work in studios at the Freda Diesing School of NW Art to explore different media and ways of artistic creation.

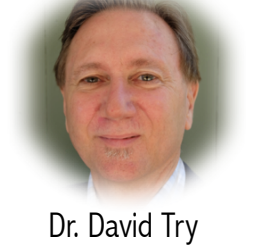
