ACTIVATING YOUR CAMPUS ACCOUNT

HOW TO CREATE YOUR CAMPUS ACCOUNT

Before creating your CAMPUS account, please make sure you have an NFB account

Click on the token link you received

You will be redirected to a new screen

Enter the name of your institution in the search bar **A**

Click on the name of your institution **B**

Click on the **CONTINUE** button **C**

You will receive a trigger e-mail. Click on the link in the e-mail within 48 hours to confirm your registration **D**

Go to nfb.ca

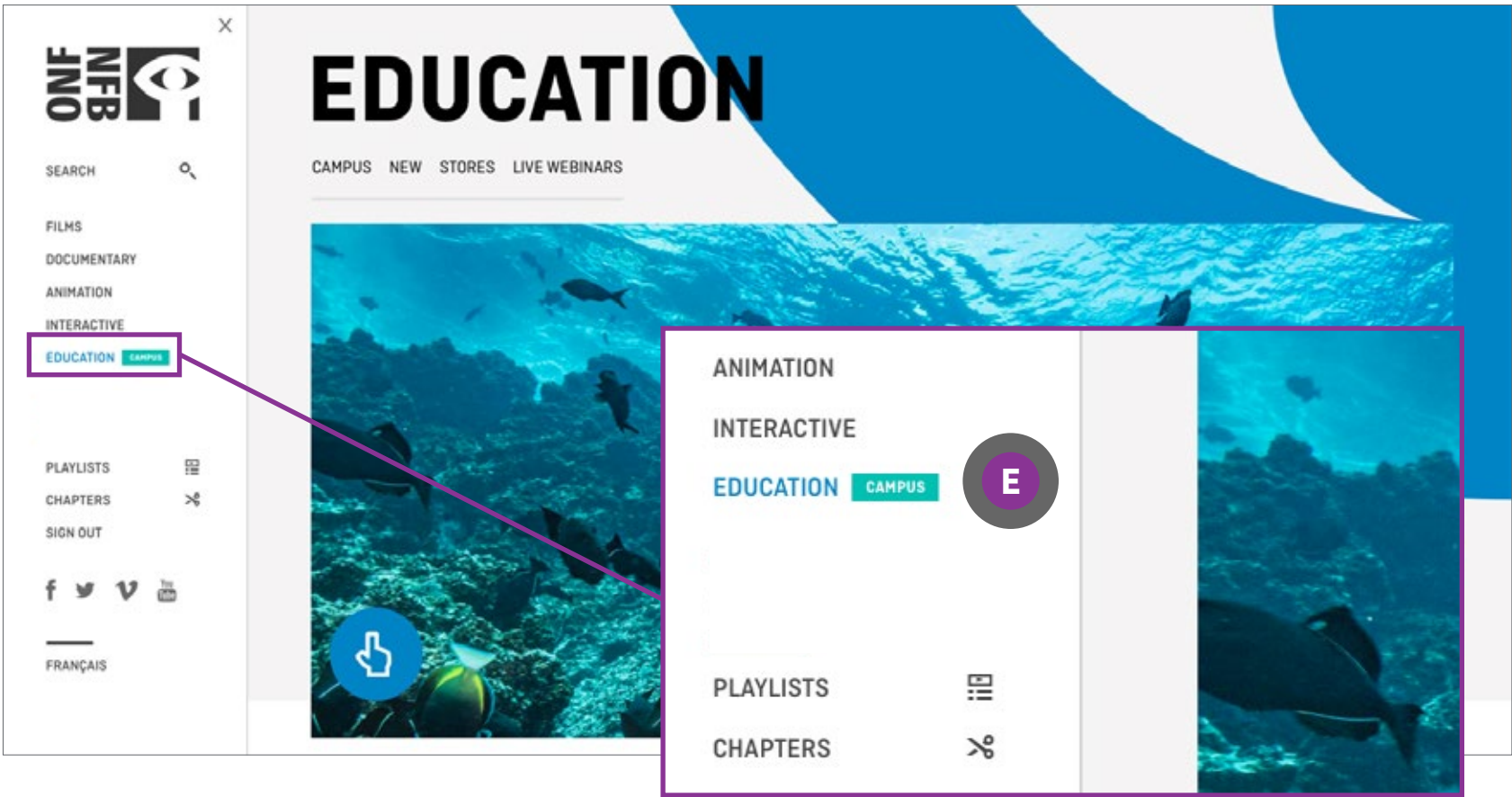
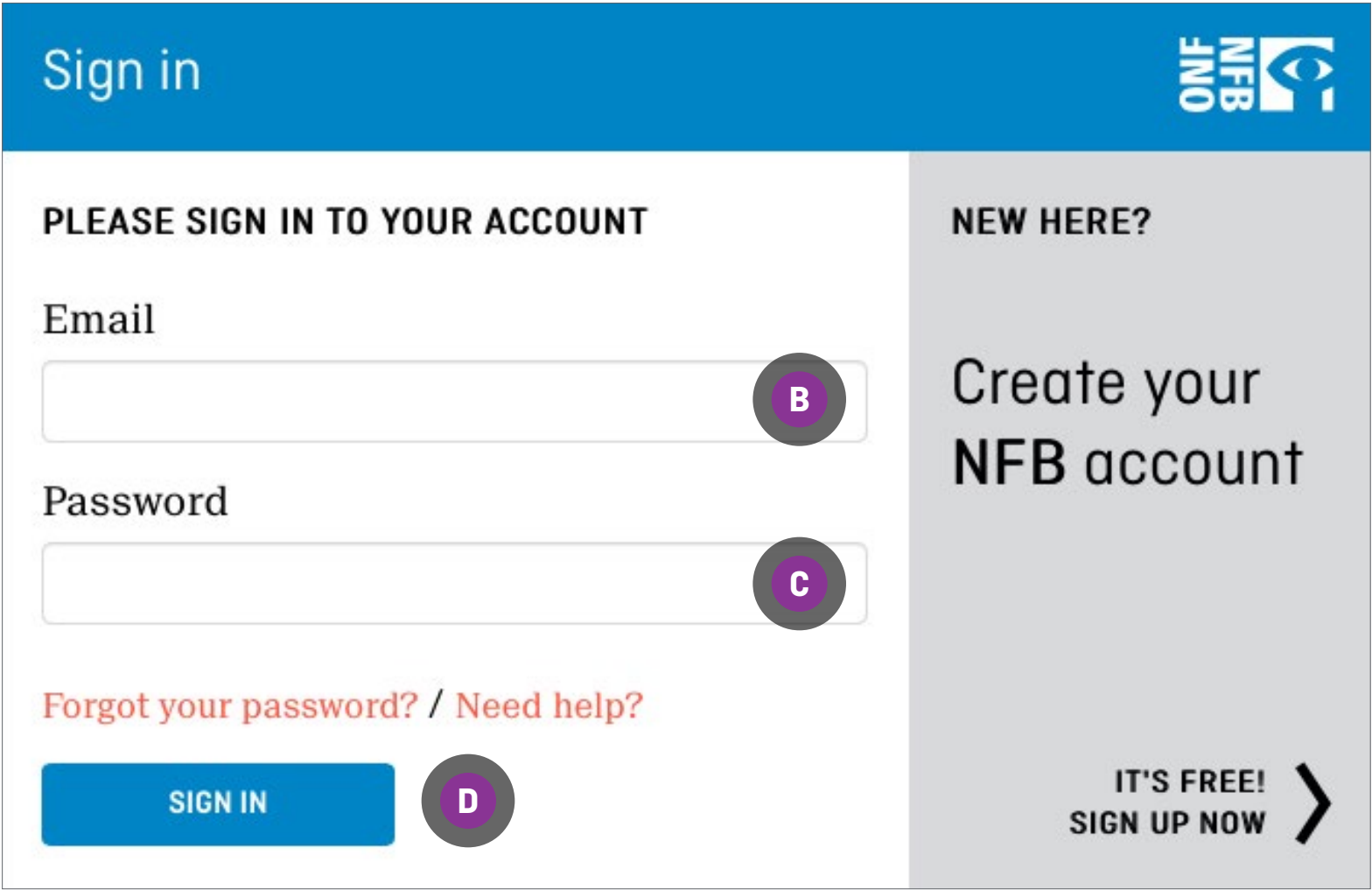
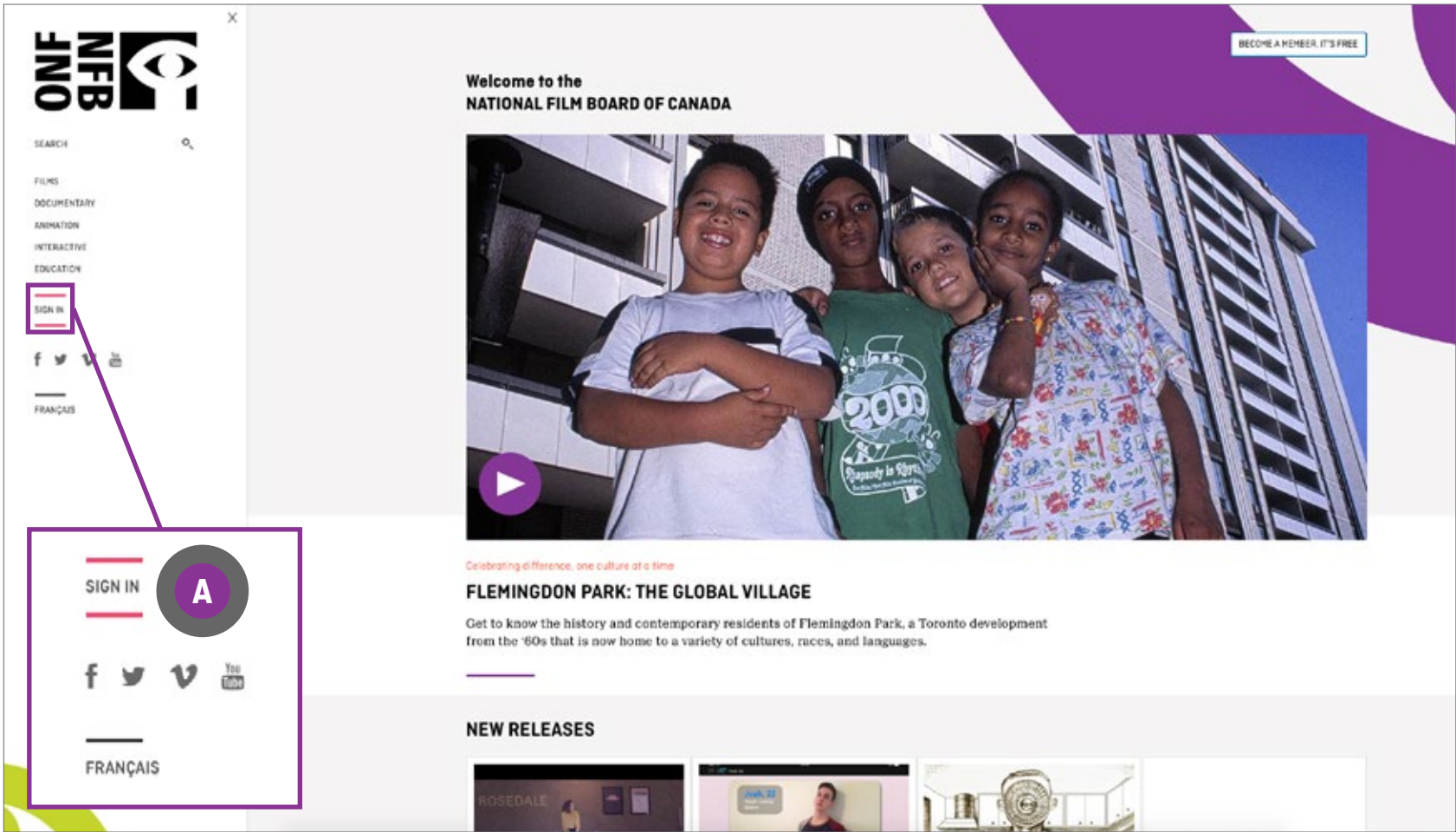
Click on **SIGN IN** **A**

You should now see your email between two turquoise lines in the left panel

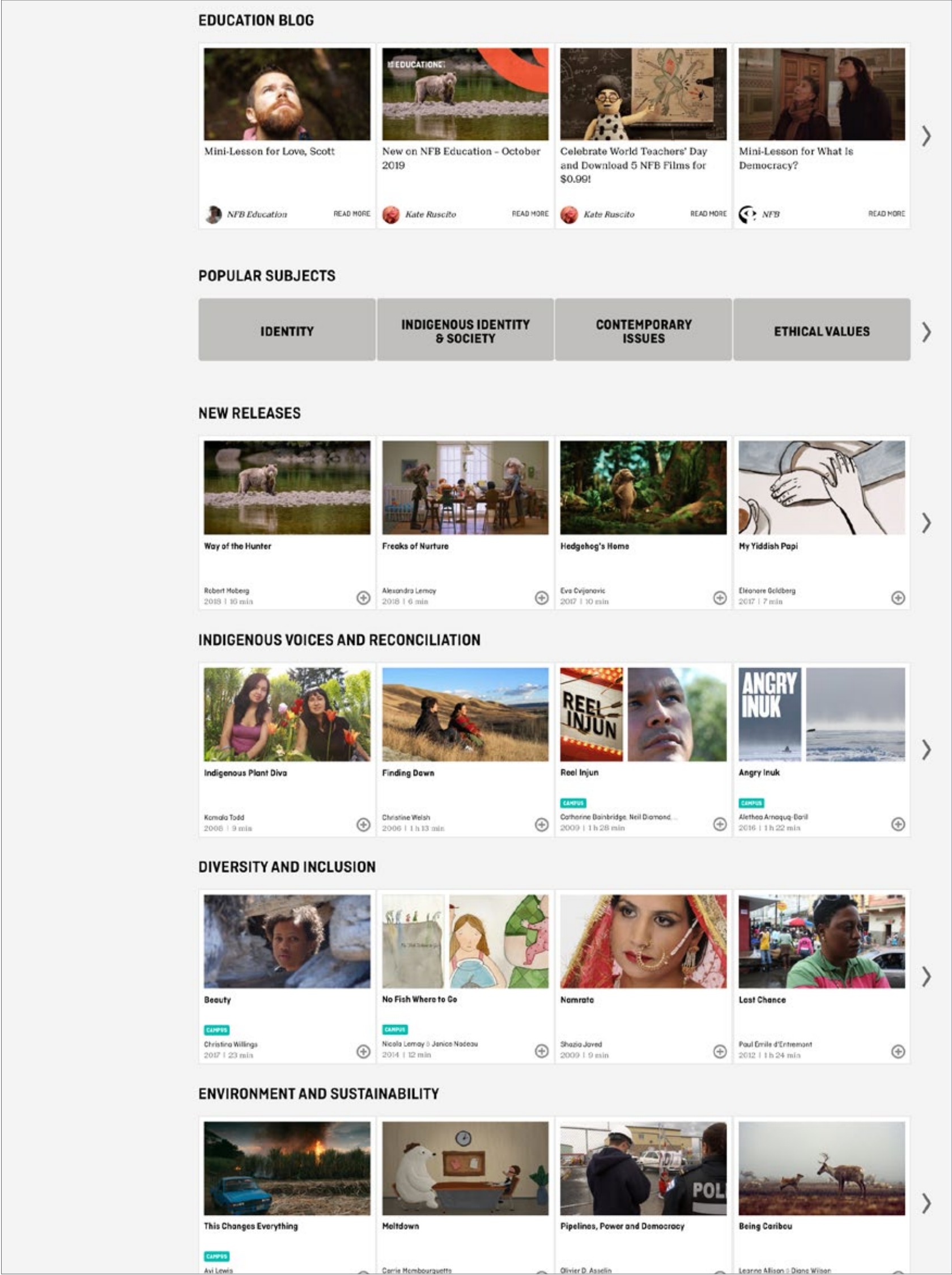
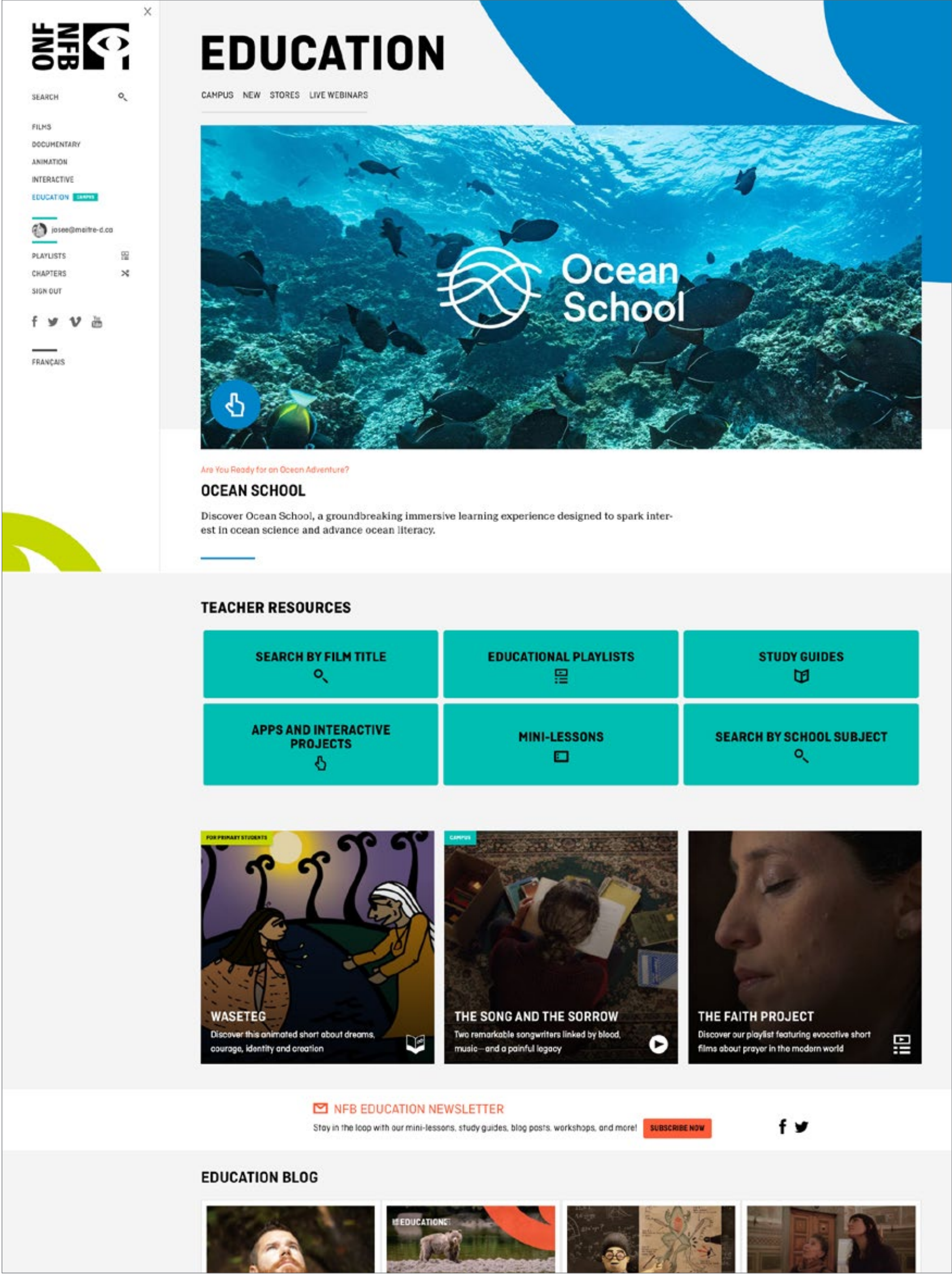

On the EDUCATION homepage, scroll down to access the now unlocked study guides, search by subjects and more.

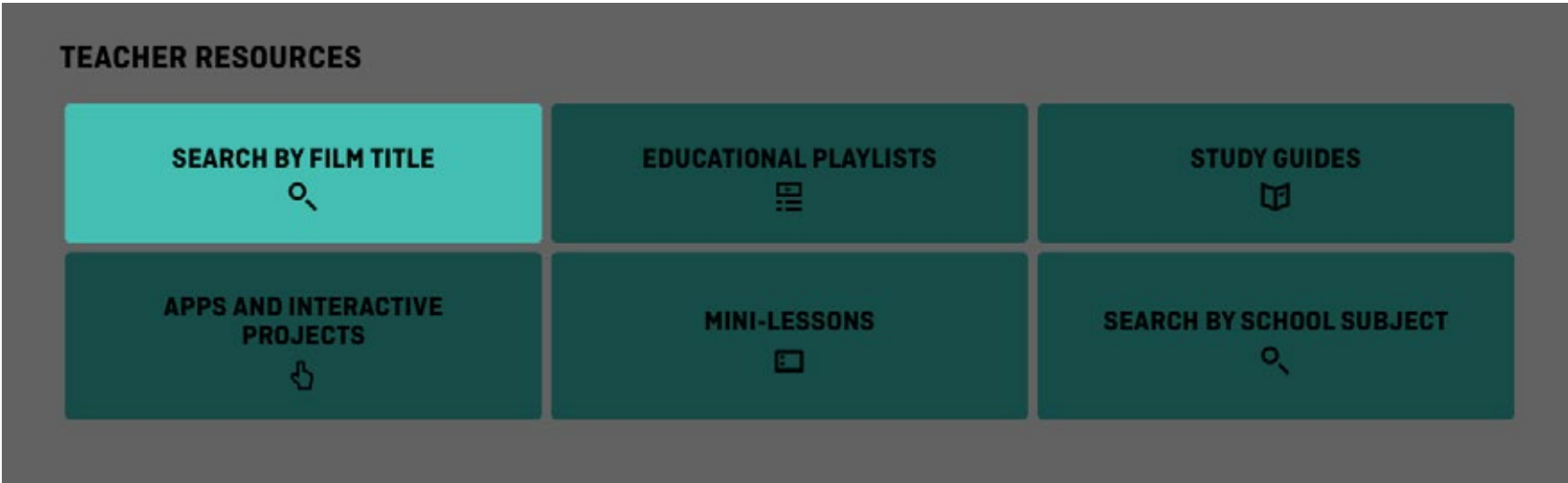
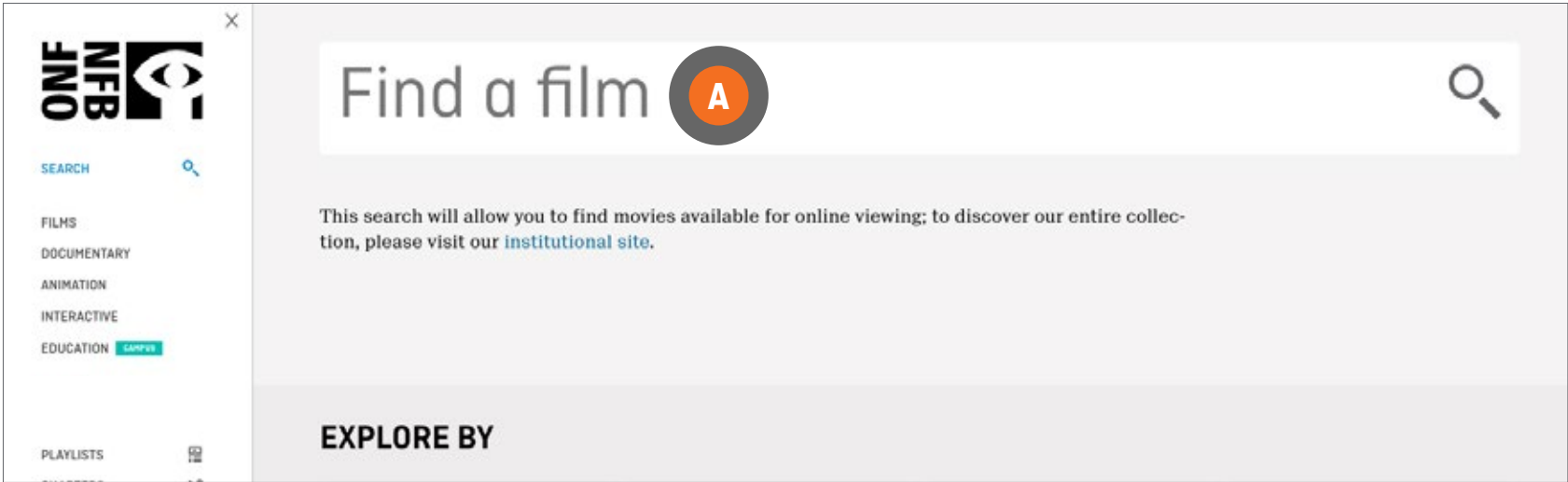


USING CAMPUS

SEARCHING BY FILM TITLE

From anywhere on the NFB website, click on the **SEARCH** tab on the left navigation bar and enter the title in the **Find a film** box **A**

To search alphabetically by film titles in the **TEACHER RESOURCES** section, click on the **SEARCH BY FILM TITLE** button



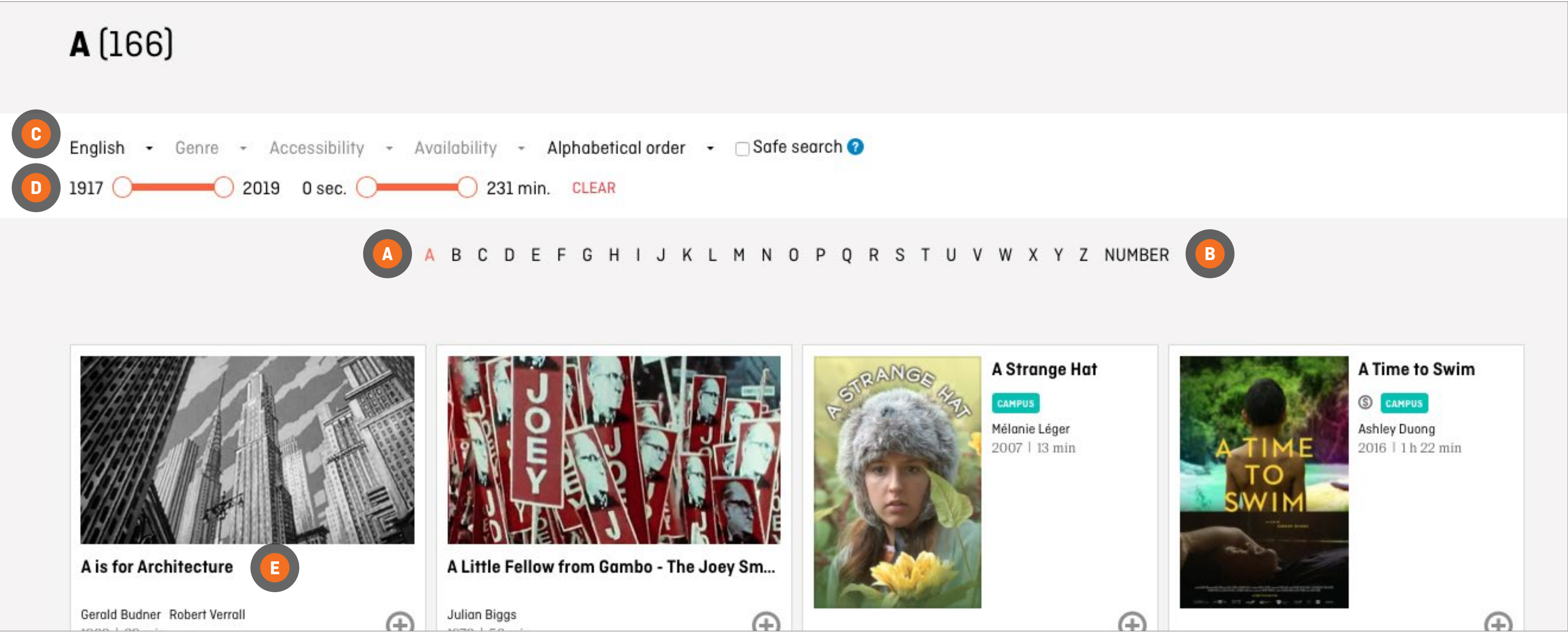
USING CAMPUS

SEARCHING BY FILM TITLE (CONTINUED)

Click on a letter to browse all film titles that begin with that letter **A**, or click on **NUMBER** **B** to browse all film titles that begin with a number

Narrow your search by language, genre, accessibility or availability by clicking on the drop-down menu next to each category and selecting an option **C**; narrow your search by production year or duration by clicking on and then sliding the circles **D**

Click the title or picture of your selected film to access it **E**

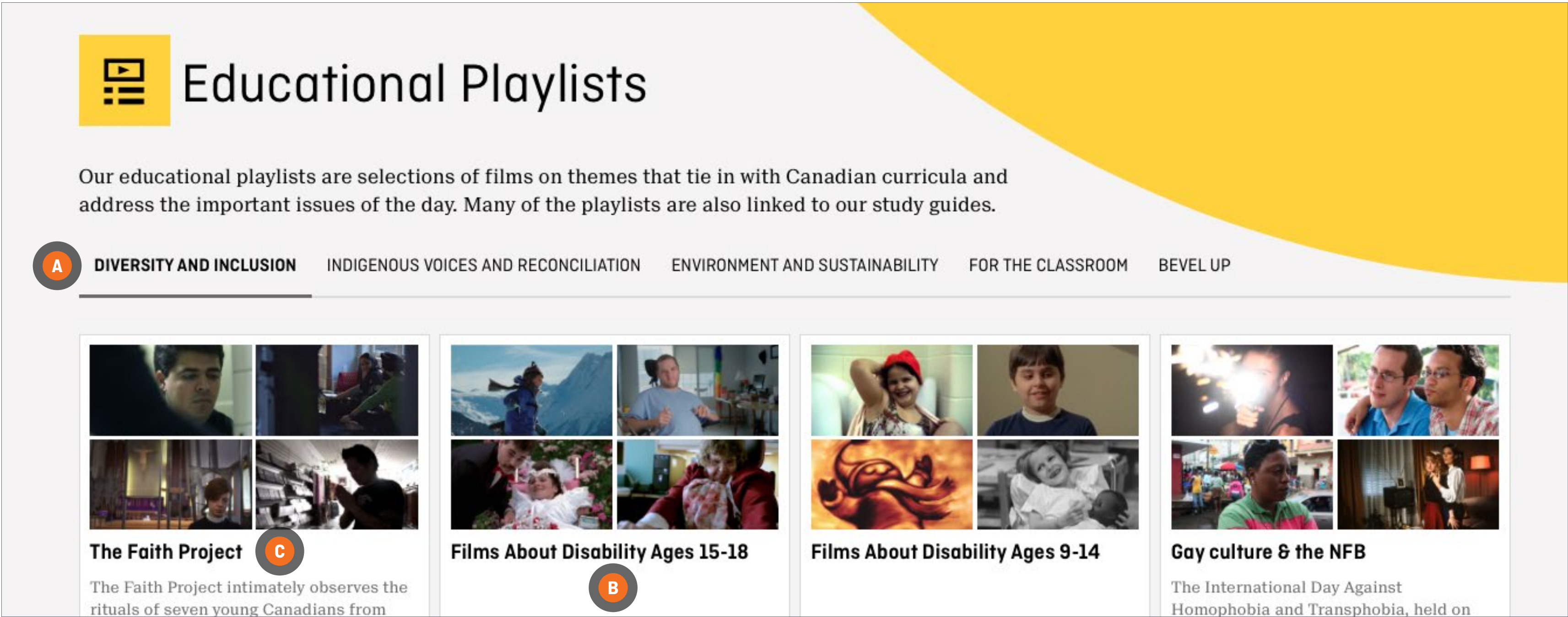
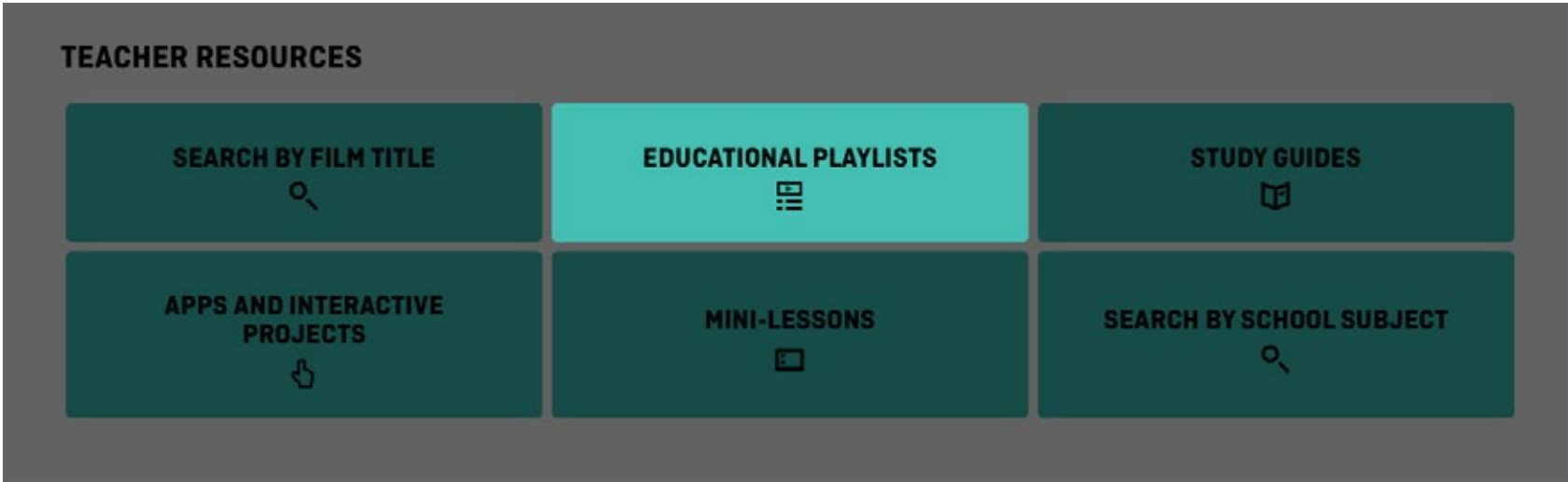
To search by educational playlist, click on the **EDUCATIONAL PLAYLISTS** button

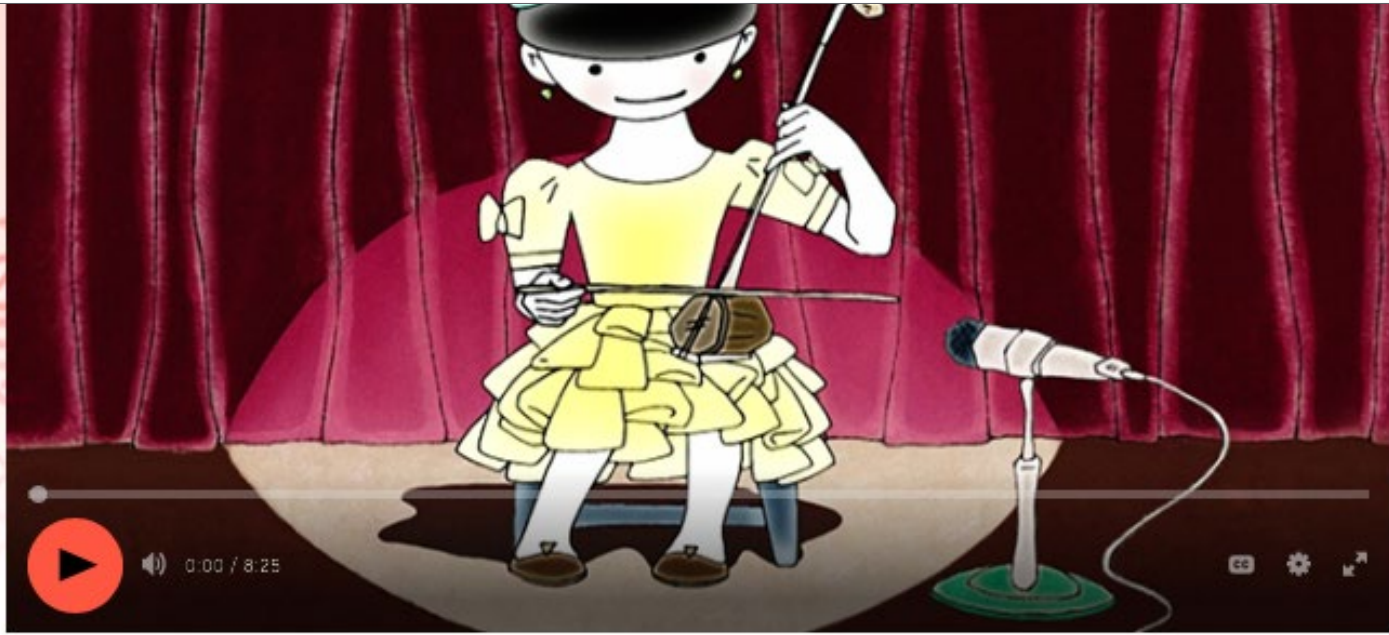
WATCHING A FILM

Some films are available for download. Downloads are not a part of the CAMPUS subscription.

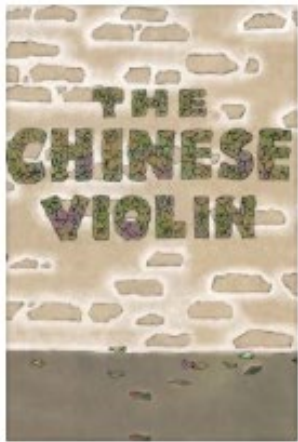

To create chapters, you will need Flash Player.

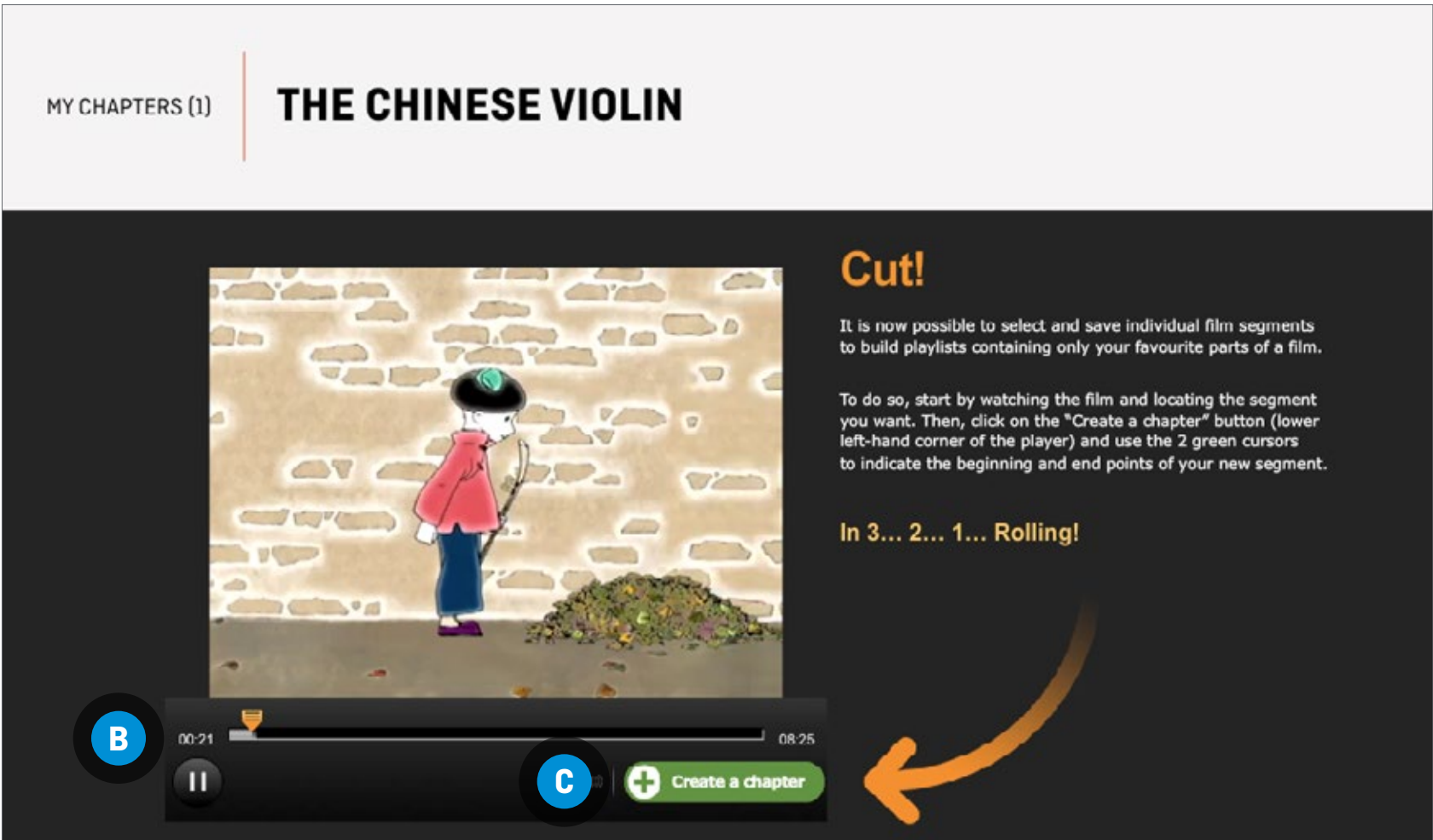
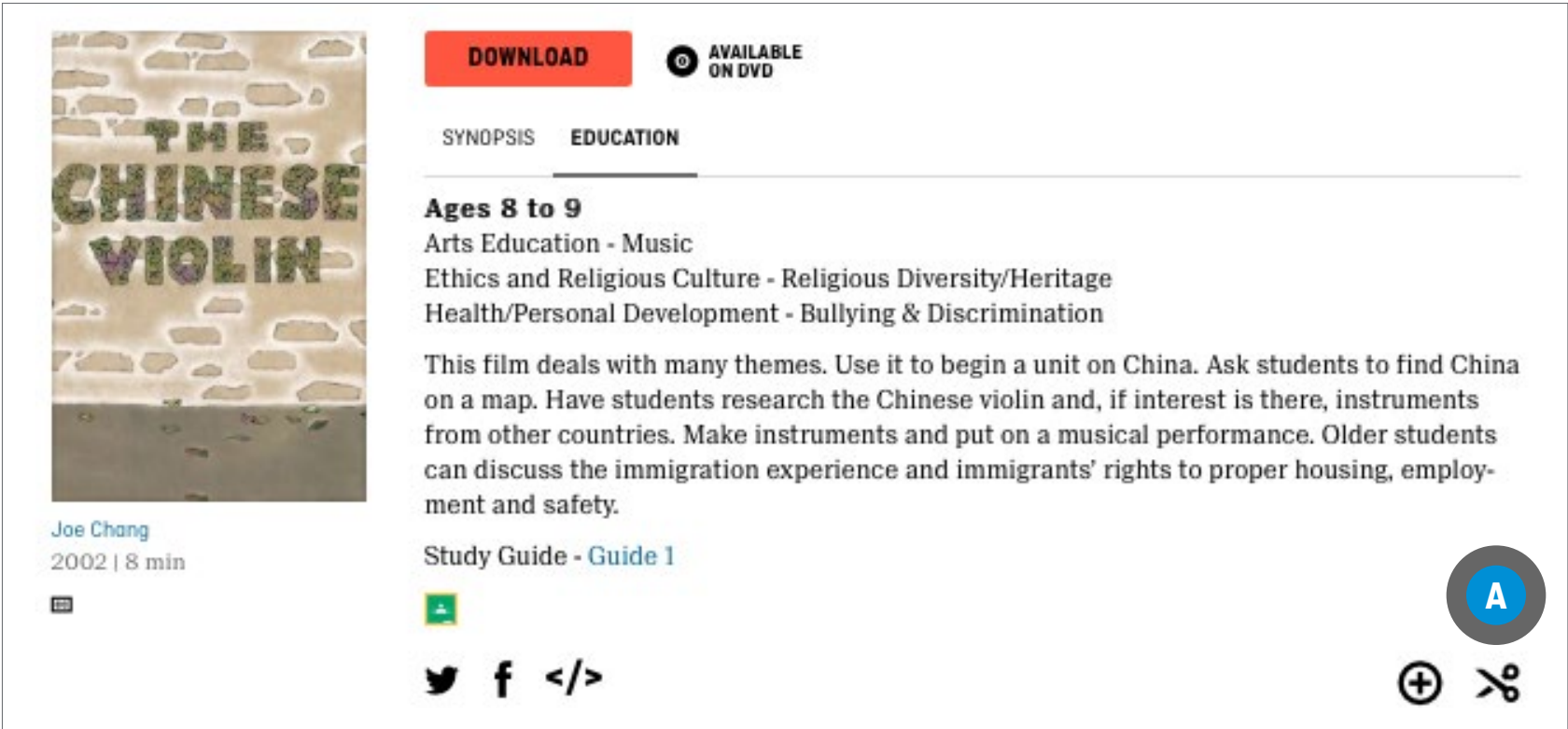
CREATING A CHAPTER

On a film page, click on the [Create a chapter](#) icon **A**

You will be redirected to a new screen

Locate the segment you want by watching the film and noting the beginning and end times on the video progress bar **B**

Click on [Create a chapter](#) **C**

Chapters are film segments created by you and containing your favourite parts of a film.

To create chapters, you will need Flash Player.

CREATING A CHAPTER (CONTINUED)

Move the two green cursors **D** to indicate the beginning and end points of your segment

OR

Click on the arrows in the **Start** and **End** boxes **E** to manually enter the start and end times

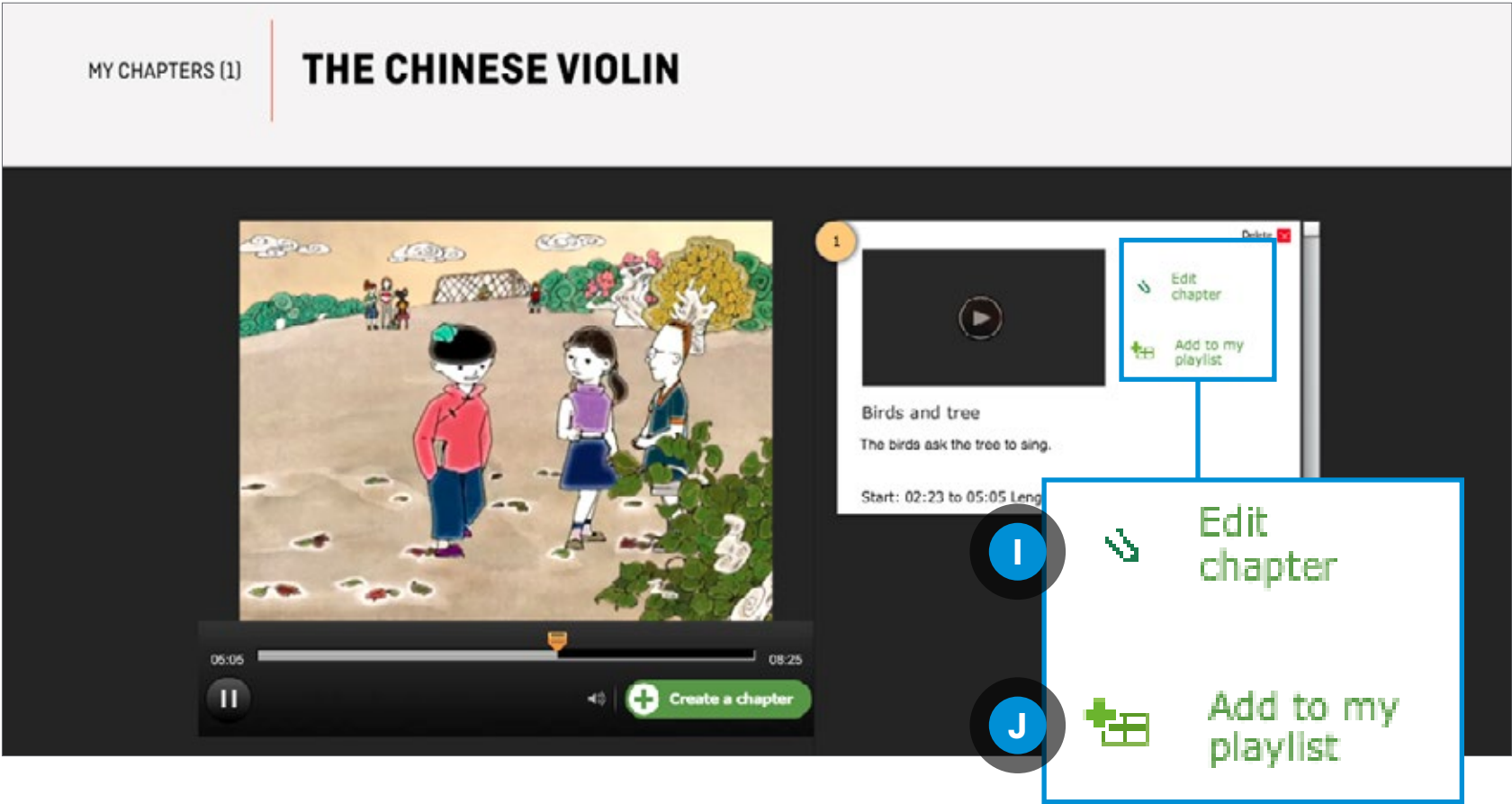
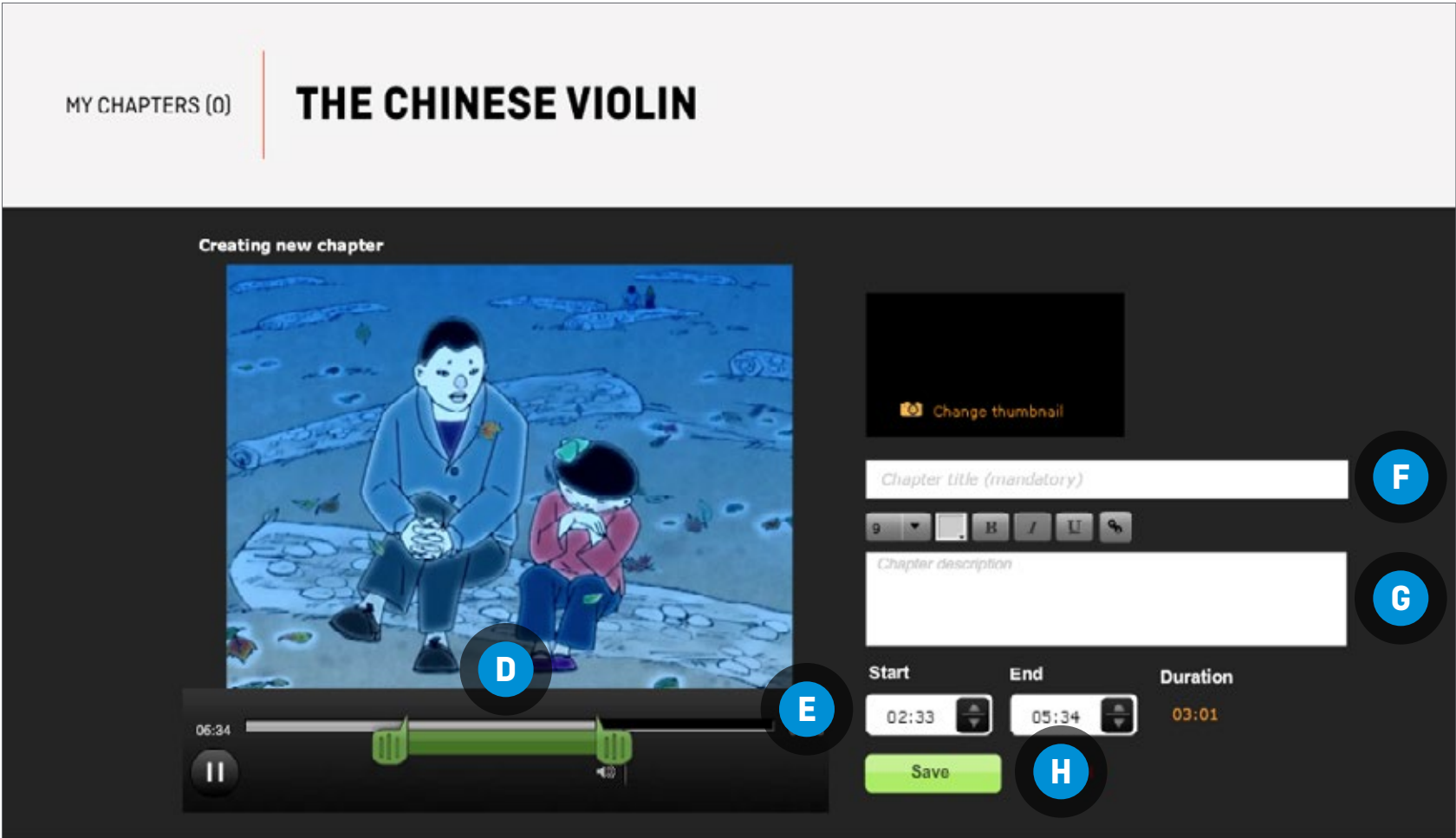
Enter a title in the **Chapter title** box **F**

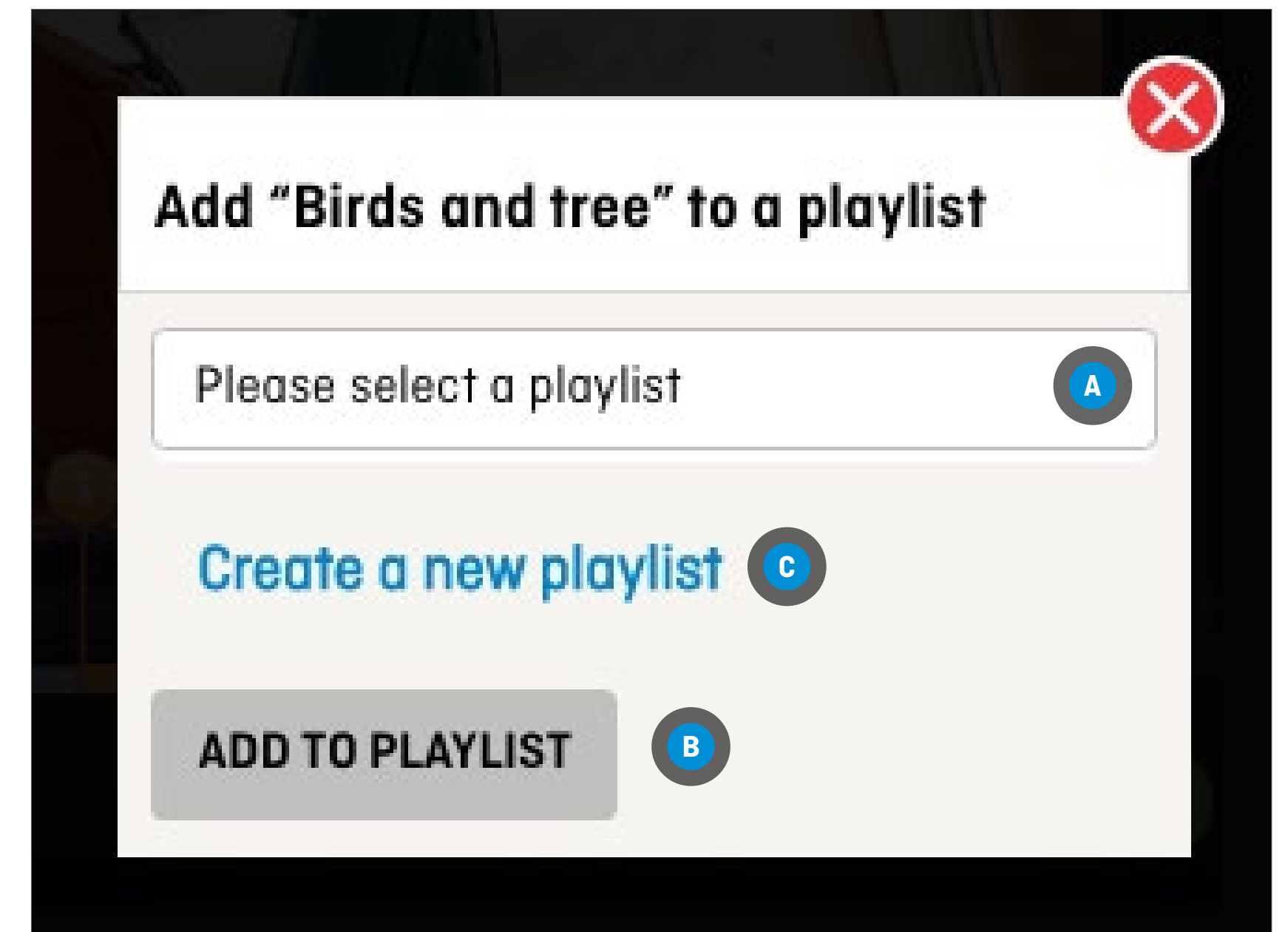
